Dear Friends,

At Epiphany we commemorate the visit of the Magi to the Baby Jesus, and thus the first manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles.

On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. (Mt. 2:11)

Epiphany traditional falls on the twelfth day after Christmas, January 6. It closes one season of the church year and opens another. In countries where the Orthodox Church is strong (such as Ethiopia) Epiphany can be a bigger day than even Christmas. Epiphany is the season of light, for Jesus is The Light of the World.

# In Ephesians Paul says:

Of this gospel I have become a servant according to the gift of God's grace that was given me by the working of his power. Although I am the very least of all the saints, this grace was given to me to bring to the Gentiles the news of the boundless riches of Christ. (3:7-8)

The good news of great joy is for *all* people. Not just people of a Jewish lineage, but non-Jewish lineage as well. Not just insiders, but outsiders. God's saving love comes through Jesus the Jew, but it reaches far beyond to embrace kings from the East, an unworthy Roman centurion with a paralyzed servant (Mt. 8:5-13), hated tax collectors and sinners (Mt. 9:10-11), a good Samaritan (Lk. 10:25-27), and you and me. The Wise Men come to offer him gifts, but he will offer himself as a gift for all people. This Baby Jesus will become The Lamb of God to take away the sin of the world.

At the end of Matthew's Gospel the disciples are commissioned to go and make disciples of *all* nations. that's our mission, too. And Pentecost will speak of the Spirit's giving us power to carry out that mission. But first let us bask in the light of Christ, who loves us and gave himself for us.

# **Community Life & Mission Updates**

On behalf of Midway Church and its Mission Committee, on December 10th Linda and Jim Mylod delivered \$100 worth of shampoo, deodorant and soap, 10 hoodies, and \$1250 worth of gift cards (Shoe Carnival, Target, Chick-Fil-A and McDonald's) to Lisa Butler for the Homeless Kids program of Anderson's School District #5. The gift cards will be distributed to youngsters in the program for Christmas purchases of shoes and clothing and for their enjoyment with friends over the Christmas break. The hoodies and toiletries will be distributed as needed during the school year. The funding for these purchases came from the very successful 2020 Yard Sale. (Proceeds from this year's yard sale were put into the General Operating Fund to help defray an anticipated year-end shortage.)

On behalf of our committee, we thank our members for their great generosity at the Christmas party in providing hats, gloves and dozens of pairs of socks, which have been donated to South Main Street Mercy Center, as well as a large quantity of first-rate toiletries that have been donated to Clean Start. The incredibly generous amount of soup and other requested items for the NICE meals delivered by Meals on Wheels will be brought to their office next week. Terry Waddell, our committee chair, said that we have the best members at Midway, and their generosity is often overwhelming to us. We thank everyone for all they did throughout the year - often in a quiet way that received no recognition but didn't go unnoticed. Due to the Covid outbreak, these past two years have been an unusual challenge for churches. But, as we struggled through our own financial difficulties, the members of Midway have remained aware of the needs of the less fortunate in our community, as directed by God.
