On Sunday, August 13th and 20th, the Ernest Workers Class and the Contemporary Class will meet together in the Fellowship Hall at 9:30. I will give a presentation of *Five Wishes*, an easy-to-use legal document written in everyday language that lets adults of all ages plan how they want to be cared for in the event they become seriously ill. There will also be information shared about other matters related to Advanced Directives.

Here's what a woman from Florida had to say about Five Wishes:

"It has been a year since my mother passed on. We knew what she wanted because she had the *Five Wishes* living will. When it came down to the end, my brother and I had no questions on what we needed to do. We had peace of mind."

Five Wishes was developed by the non-profit Aging with Dignity, a leading voice for the needs of older people and those who care for them. Founder Jim Towey created the program with the help of doctors, nurses, lawyers, and other experts in end -of-life care. Jim is an attorney who worked twelve years for Mother Teresa of Calcutta and one year in her home for the dying in Washington, D.C.
