Friends in Christ,

It has been a joy to begin the year as pulpit supply and worshiping with the congregation of Midway Presbyterian Church and I am now looking forward to serving as your Stated Supply pastor. I appreciate the warm welcome you have already given me. Over the last several weeks I have had an opportunity to meet and have conversation with some of you. I am eager for those opportunities for conversations to continue as I learn more about you and the Midway Church.

February 14th is Valentine's Day but this year it is also Ash Wednesday and marks the beginning of the season of Lent. There will be a Worship service at noon that day and I hope many of you can be there (and consider inviting a friend). As a spiritual practice, many people will 'give up' something during this season. It can also be especially meaningful to 'take up' something new as a practice during Lent. This could be a time to try a new spiritual discipline such as journaling, reading a Lenten devotional, trying a prayer practice such as centering prayer.

This year the lectionary takes us into the gospel of Mark. The 40 days of Lent could be an opportunity to read this short gospel and then consider it through the lens of Lectio Divina (divine reading). Briefly, in this practice, the text is read through slowly several times; then time is spent thinking about the text; that leads to a time of prayer followed by a time of simply resting in God's presence.

Regardless of how you mark this season, we will worship together during the six Sundays as well as Ash Wednesday and Maundy Thursday. Hope to see you there.


