Dear Friends,

More than 12 years ago, I worked with the Rev. Debbie Foster (Now our Presbytery Leader and Stated Clerk) and a number of other dedicated people on a Spirit led quest to find positive ways to address the challenges that churches were experiencing. The approach was totally new to all of us, we quite literally gave ourselves up to the power of the Holy Spirit to lead us and instruct us. The result was astounding and unforgettable. One of the specific conclusions from our time together went all the way back to the Reformation; we realized that the focus of all we do in the church should be the Gospel of Jesus Christ, "THE STORY" and we began to further realize that our personal stories and journeys are a viable component in spreading the good news.

This was when an idea began to form in my mind. I wanted to begin compiling faith stories, but I had no earthly idea how or where to begin. About this time I found an article in the PCUSA newsletter about a little church in Woodhull, Illinois that had this same type of idea. Led by their pastor, Rev. Cheyanna Losey, they had successfully compiled a book of stories and testimonies and used the experience as an evangelism tool that sparked growth in their church and gained them recognition both locally and nationally. I contacted Rev. Losey. She was unbelievably gracious and generous as well as encouraging. She not only sent me a copy of the book but also a copy of her doctoral paper on the entire process of compiling the stories and turning them into **Everyone Has A Place In God's Choir.** 

I invited the congregation of my home church to consider sharing their stories using some of the tools Cheyanna had shared. After many months I had 12 wonderful stories. That may not sound like many, but the effect on me was life changing. These stories enriched me spiritually in a way I would never have anticipated. I bound the stories and gave one to each of the contributors. I have used them in many sermons over the years because they are so powerful. People relate to them and in turn their faith is enriched.

If you have ever wanted to share your story, I would really appreciate the opportunity to talk with you. Even if writing is not your best gift, but you have a tale to tell, there's a way to work together to get your story out there. Three of the stories I collected in 2014 were written using this method.

I'll leave you with this quote; Rev. Debbie Foster said to me while we were doing this sacred work all those years ago, "**It's hard not to love someone once you know their story.**"



#### MOWS Route 15 is in need of a Driver

As most of you know, Midway Church has covered this Meals on Wheels route for over 30 years. Over those years we've lost many dedicated delivery folks/drivers, and gained others, thank God. But the route is handled each month by ten drivers, or teams of drivers, and each team delivers 2 or 3 days per month. Two of these teams are people who were Midway Church members decades ago, but have remained faithful to their MOWS commitment, for which we're incredibly grateful. Most months, when all our drivers are healthy and in town, we can handle the route. But when someone is sick/laid up or on vacation, we're stretched too tightly. We need at least one more driver/team and are asking you to think about any friends, neighbors or family members who might consider delivering twice a month. The entire process of picking up the food at the MOWS building on Fant Street, to making the deliveries to about a dozen homes in the area from Marchbanks Avenue to Williamston Road, takes most of us 1.5 to 2 hours, depending on how far away the driver lives.

With the exception of the two newest additions to our driver schedule, most of us are "of an age" that can be concerning for the future of our Route. So our hope is that we can supplement our driver schedule now to plan properly for the future. Please pray on this need; thank you. And a huge gracious Thank You to our current driver teams; without them we would have to relinquish this important ministry.
